| Course Title   | Course description   |  |  |

| Master's Thesis<br>碩士論文  | Students enroll in the Master's Thesis course must be conducting<br>psychology research in counselling, clinical, or industrial-<br>organizational psychology and be supervised by psychology faculty<br>members conducting research in the respective areas. With<br>approval, students independently design and implement the specific<br>research procedure, develop materials, collect and analyze data, and<br>interpret results. Students have the primary responsibility to<br>communicate with the major professor for ensuring that all aspects<br>of thesis work are conducted appropriately and adequately. |  |  |
| Advanced Statistics<br>高等統計學   | This course is designed to expand and enhance student knowledge<br>and understanding of statistical methodology pertaining to<br>multivariate techniques applied in the behavioral sciences. The<br>purpose of this course is for students to develop skills with a wide<br>range of statistical procedures for multivariate data analysis. Topics<br>to be covered may include multivariate data examination, analysis<br>of covariance, MANOVA, multidimensional scaling, factor<br>analysis, hierarchical linear modeling, and structural equation<br>modeling.   |  |  |
| Research Methods in<br>Behavioral and Social<br>Sciences<br>行為與社會科學研究法 | This course introduces research methods that are commonly applied<br>in the behavioral and social sciences. Through learning activities,<br>students will participate in the crucial stages of research procedures,<br>such as research topics selection, research design, sampling, data<br>collection, measurements, data analysis, and research report writing.<br>The ultimate goal of this course is to encourage students to develop<br>a passion for conducting research and to cultivate their<br>understanding of the practical value of systematic information<br>gathering and decision making.             |  |  |
| Seminar (I)<br>學術研討(一)   | Seminar is a form of academic instruction. It has the function of<br>bringing together small groups for recurring meetings, focusing<br>each time on some particular subject, in which everyone present is<br>requested to actively participate. This is often accomplished through<br>a more formal presentation of research as well as an ongoing<br>debate. Seminars are a crucial part in the process of attaining an<br>academic research degree.   |  |  |
| Seminar (II)<br>學術研討(二)  | The key idea of seminar is to familiarize students more extensively<br>with the methodology of their chosen subject and also to allow them<br>to interact with examples of the practical problems that often occur<br>during research work. It is essentially a place where assigned<br>readings are discussed, questions can be raised, and debates can be<br>conducted. It is relatively informal, at least compared to the lecture<br>system of academic instruction.   |  |  |

| Career of Psychological<br>Professions<br>心理學專業深造與實踐                              | This course introduces and examines the various careers within the<br>psychological profession. Learning activities will aid students in<br>developing abilities to choose suitable career paths in psychology<br>that match their talents, interests, and life goals.   |  |  |  |
| Advanced Social<br>Psychology<br>高等社會心理學  | This course will cover relevant topics and issues of modern social<br>psychology. Main readings are articles from recent issues of social<br>psychological journals. For each class session, one student will<br>present that week's assigned readings. Every student should finish<br>the readings, participate in subsequent group discussions, grade the<br>presenter, and submit a one-page "comment" paper each week. At<br>the end of the semester, students will turn in a term paper on a<br>social psychological topic  |  |  |  |
| Theories and Techniques<br>of Counseling and<br>Psychotherapy<br>諮商與心理治療理論與<br>技術 | The purposes of this course are to introduce students counseling and<br>psychotherapy classical and popular theories and skills, ethics, and<br>professional values. The course encompasses two parts: (a)<br>introduction of counseling and psychotherapy functions,<br>development, and ethics; (b) classical and latest developed<br>counseling and psychotherapy theories.   |  |  |  |
| Advanced Industrial and<br>Organizational<br>Psychology<br>高等工業與組織心理學             | The purpose of this course is, first for students to build concrete<br>knowledge of the applications of industrial and organizational<br>psychology in organizations and the workplaces. Then, students will<br>learn to view as I-O organizational psychologists to identify<br>successful factors for enhancing the well-being of people who work<br>for the organization and ultimately improving organizational<br>performance. Students are required to read various research and<br>practices and discuss in-depth in class on how to facilitate<br>organizations transition among periods of change and development<br>as well as how behaviors and attitudes can be improved through<br>hiring practices, training programs, and feedback systems.                         |  |  |  |
| Community Mental<br>Health<br>社區心理衛生  | This course provides professional knowledge and skills essential to<br>community health situations. It focuses on the health assessments<br>and health promotions at the community level. Specifically, the<br>Health Belief Model, Theory of Reasoned Action, Theory of<br>Planned Behavior, and related models and their applications in the<br>community will be discussed in detail. In addition, a variety of<br>community mental health problems, including substance abuse,<br>suicide, domestic violence, adaptation to various chronic illness,<br>and depression of the elderly in community will be examined.<br>Students are required to choose a special topic to develop thorough<br>knowledge and skills in preparation for a career in community<br>mental health. |  |  |  |
| Advanced Psychology<br>心理學深論  | This course will guide students to expand their knowledge deeply<br>and profoundly in the contemporary research and theory regarding<br>the diverse approaches to the study of mental processes and<br>behavior psychology. The topics of this course may encompass, but<br>not limited to, various subfields, such as experimental, social,   |  |  |  |

|  | cognitive, developmental, educational, and positive psychology.<br>Students are required to select and study a topic, of which she/he<br>should construct solid and concrete knowledge pertaining to the<br>most up-to-date research and theory.  |  |  |

| Psychopathology<br>心理病理學                       | The major goal of this course is to build on student's understanding<br>of psychopathology by reviewing concepts, theories, and research<br>related to descriptive psychopathology, the issues of etiology, the<br>application of a bio-psycho-social conceptual framework to case<br>formulation, the criteria for differential diagnosis, and to a lesser<br>degree, psychopharmacological treatment of the mental disorders<br>covered in the course. In addition, this course will provide an in-<br>depth review of a broad spectrum of psychopathological conditions<br>as defined in both the DSM–IV–TR and the DSM–V. The purpose of<br>such an arrangement is for students to be able to utilize interviewing<br>skills, behavioral observation, mental status exam, and the DSM–IV–<br>TR and the DSM–V to generate and evaluate diagnostic possibilities,<br>derive a diagnosis, and to be able to place this diagnosis into a<br>broader conceptualization of the patient(s)/client(s). |  |  |
| Advanced Cultural<br>Psychology<br>高等文化心理學     | This course addresses questions about the role of culture in<br>psychology. How it may contribute to individual differences and<br>social behaviors. This course will select topics in Social Psychology<br>and review related empirical findings from mainstream, cross-<br>cultural, and indigenous psychologies. Students are encouraged to<br>examine the differences between these three perspectives and then<br>integrate them to develop their theorizations.   |  |  |
| Advanced Positive<br>Psychology<br>高等正向心理學     | This course is an in-depth exploration of positive psychology.<br>Critically examine how psychologists conceptualize psychological<br>well-being. We will investigate practices in achieving meaning of<br>life and examine the mechanisms underneath them. This class will<br>also review the development and major perspectives in positive<br>psychology. Students are expected to read selected journal articles<br>and submit "thought" paper before class.  |  |  |
| Trends and Issues in<br>Psychology<br>心理學議題與趨勢 | This course offers various topics pertaining to contemporary trends<br>and issues in psychology. Topics may include counseling and<br>psychotherapy, community mental health, social, psychopathology,<br>organizational, cultural, positive psychology, et al. Students are<br>expected to read and discuss on selected journal articles.  |  |  |
